The Liturgy of the Word

THE SCRIPTURE READING

Zechariah 9:9-12

Writing during the return from exile in Babylon, the prophet offers the hope of a new king sent by God, who will be humble and a peacemaker.

The Coming Ruler of God's People

Rejoice greatly, O daughter Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter Jerusalem! Lo, your king comes to you; triumphant and victorious is he, humble and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey. 10 He will cut off the chariot from Ephraim and the war-horse from Jerusalem;
and the battle bow shall be cut off, and he shall command peace to the nations; his dominion shall be from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth.
11 As for you also, because of the blood of my covenant with you, I will set your prisoners free from the waterless pit.

¹² Return to your stronghold, O prisoners of hope; today I declare that I will restore to you double.

THE GOSPEL

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew Glory to you, O Lord.

Yet wisdom is vindicated by her deeds.
